## **Council Highlights, May 2023**

Council President, Joe Hoksbergen, opened the May Council meeting by reading from Philippians 1 and discussed "faithful maturity". We should all love the church, pray for her, and have joy and confidence in Christ. He then prayed for the church, the Council meeting, healing for members in our congregation suffering from cancer, and for the John and Leann Hogan family in the death of Ruth Ozinga.

Pastor Brad met with the Sully CRC council about shepherding. He is thankful for all the contacts Calvary's shepherding teams make. Pastor Brad and Ivan Mulder will be attending Synod in June. It will be a busy session this year with a very large agenda with 79 overture requests from different congregations. That is up from the typical 6-10 overtures.

Pastor Nate is winding down the education programs for the season and gearing up for the summer season programs. There will be a SERVE trip to Montana with 13 youths signed up to go. He is also working on a Chicago Westside Christian School trip this summer and continued assistance throughout the year. Five seniors from Calvary are graduating high school this year.

Orville Bultsma has had to resign as Elder and Consistory President due to his health and cancer treatments. Joe Hoksbergen has agreed to fill in as Consistory President until next January, as well as continuing as Council President. The Council agreed not to replace Orville as elder because he is an Admin elder without shepherding duties. Admin and Council will finish the year one elder short.

The Council approved a request from Building and Grounds to replace two church furnaces and ductwork for \$18,760. New parking lot lights are ready for installation. The new carpet planned for the Youth House will be deferred until next year. New keycards to enter the church on off-hours are available for pickup at the Welcome Center. The old keycards will become inactive later this month.

All scheduled audits of 2022 funds have been completed
