Council Highlights, July 2023

Council President, Joe Hoksbergen, opened the July Council meeting by reading from The Gospel Coalition website by Erik Raymond about intentional and purposeful evangelism. We need to use our time wisely here on Earth bringing the gospel to unbelievers by building relationships.

Pastor Brad has gone to the Cadet International Camporee in Ontario. He will also be taking a one week sabbatical to Ecuador for a ministry partnership with the Multiplication Network the week of Oct 12.

The new 2023 Directory is ready for Council review. It contains new sections with a table of contents and an introduction, purpose, and responsibility of each committee along with names of members and the chair. The Directory will be reformatted to 8- $1/2" \times 11"$ paper size and renamed the 2023 Membership Guide.

The 2023 Handbook is also ready for Council review. It has been updated with active headings and a table of contents has been added to make it easier to find specific duties.

The Council is planning a service retreat for Saturday, August 5, at Joshua Christian Academy. Details have not been finalized, yet. Due to scheduling difficulties a retreat at Lake View Camp was dropped.

The next Classis meeting will be held at Trinity CRC in St Louis, MO, September 15-16. Pastor Brad, Ivan Mulder, and Aaron Sandbulte plan to attend.

The congregation is encouraged to submit nominations for new elders and deacons for 2024.You will be receiving nomination forms with a list of members not eligible. Four new elders are needed for 3 year terms and one for a 2 year term to replace Orville Bultsma. Three deacons are retiring.

All families with children who attend or want to attend Christian schools are requested to fill out a short survey in order to assist the Christian Education Fund committee determine how to distribute funding. Calvary's Christian Education Fund remains fully committed to making Christian School tuition affordable to Calvary parents through tuition assistance and educational loans. With the advent of the new Education Savings Account legislation passed by the State of Iowa this year, the committee has been developing a path forward to integrate this new funding stream into our annual distribution plan. To formulate this year's distribution recommendation to the Council, parents will be contacted by their shepherd team so the ESA status of their children enrolled in Pella Christian Schools can be determined. Please return the survey to your District Elder or Deacon no later than September 1 to be considered in this fall's disbursement plan.

Ivan Mulder closed the meeting with prayer.
