The Young At Heart Group Enjoys a Day Trip

It was a beautiful day for the Young At Heart Group and their friends to go on a day trip excursion to Lucas County, Iowa. Our first stop was in Chariton at the Piper's Old Fashioned Grocery Store. Their specialty is Piper's Candy, and they demonstrated to us how they make the confection variety. Yum, yum, that was something we didn't want to pass up. Also, at Chariton, we took a tour of part of the Hy-Vee Distribution Center. We drove past the Truck Department, which employees 251 truck drivers and the Fuel Island Facility, which is large enough to park 156 tractors. Inside we had a tour of BananaLand where bananas are carefully ripened in one of the twenty-seven ripening rooms through the controlled use of ethylene gas, a natural product of the fruit. The humidity and temperature are constantly monitored to ensure the Hy-Vee stores receive the bananas at the proper stage of the five-day ripening process. We also saw the Produce Department, which is kept at a constant temperature of fifty degrees. The Chariton Distribution Center has a total of 203,110 square feet devoted to the Produce Warehouse. Here they store 4,200 different items. We gained a new appreciation for the grocery business.

We then drove to Humeston, Iowa. After arriving at Humeston, we broke up into two groups. One group went to eat lunch at the Grass Roots Café, while the other group went shopping at Snyder's. The Grass Roots Café is a small Café and is an excellent place to eat. Some folks even went back for some very delicious desserts. Synder's is the "mini-Walmart" of Humeston. It has something for everyone, including clothing, accessories, gifts, collectibles and so much more. It certainly is a fun place to shop.

On our way back home, we stopped at Schmuker's Bulk Foods and Discount Grocery. It is located on Hwy 14 and is a fun Amish stop. We all enjoyed doing some more shopping for more candy and grocery items. It is a great place to go for fresh peaches when they are in season.

We had a wonderful time visiting our neighbors located south of us, and the fellow-ship was best of all.
